



ABOUT KESEM AND CAMP KESEM

Kesem is the leading national nonprofit that supports children affected by a parent's cancer. Founded in 2000, Kesem's community of more than 4,000 volunteer college student leaders at more than 130 college campus chapters across the country provides year-round programs and services to support children ages 6-18 at no cost to families. Its flagship program, Camp Kesem, is a week-long, sleep-away summer camp. At camp, kids have fun and build connections with each other and counselors who understand and are trained to support their needs. Beyond camp, year-round services such as care packages, personalized greetings, birthday cards, local gatherings, leadership groups, and affinity groups provide a continuum of touchpoints for campers and their families.

WHO CAN ATTEND? Camp Kesem serves children 6 to 18 years old who have lost a parent to cancer, have a parent currently undergoing cancer treatment, or whose parent is a cancer survivor–an estimated population of over 5 million children in the United States.

HOW LONG ARE THE CAMPS?

The camps are typically one week in length.

HOW MUCH DOES CAMP COST? Camp Kesem is completely free to all children who attend.

WHO RUNS THE CAMPS? Our camps are staffed by highly trained college student leaders. These students are carefully screened through a competitive interview process and undergo extensive training prior to camp. Our student leaders work year-round to raise funds, conduct outreach in their communities, and plan programming to make camp a truly unique and unforgettable experience. Each camp is also staffed with nursing and mental health professionals.

CAN CHILDREN RETURN TO CAMP KESEM MORE THAN ONCE? Yes! Kesem campers are part of our family for life and they love the bonds they form with friends who return year after year.

DOES CAMP KESEM PROVIDE THERAPY? No. Our student leaders provide a warm and loving environment where children are free to share their feelings with one another. Our model focuses on providing a strong peer-based support network where children can find strength, hope, compassion, and fun.

WHAT HAPPENS AT CAMP? During camp, children can participate in activities such as boating, horseback riding, archery, crafts, and more. Camp also includes our signature Empowerment Ceremony. The Empowerment Ceremony gives children the opportunity to discuss their experiences with a parent's cancer. During camp, nurses and mental health professionals are present to provide support for the children.
